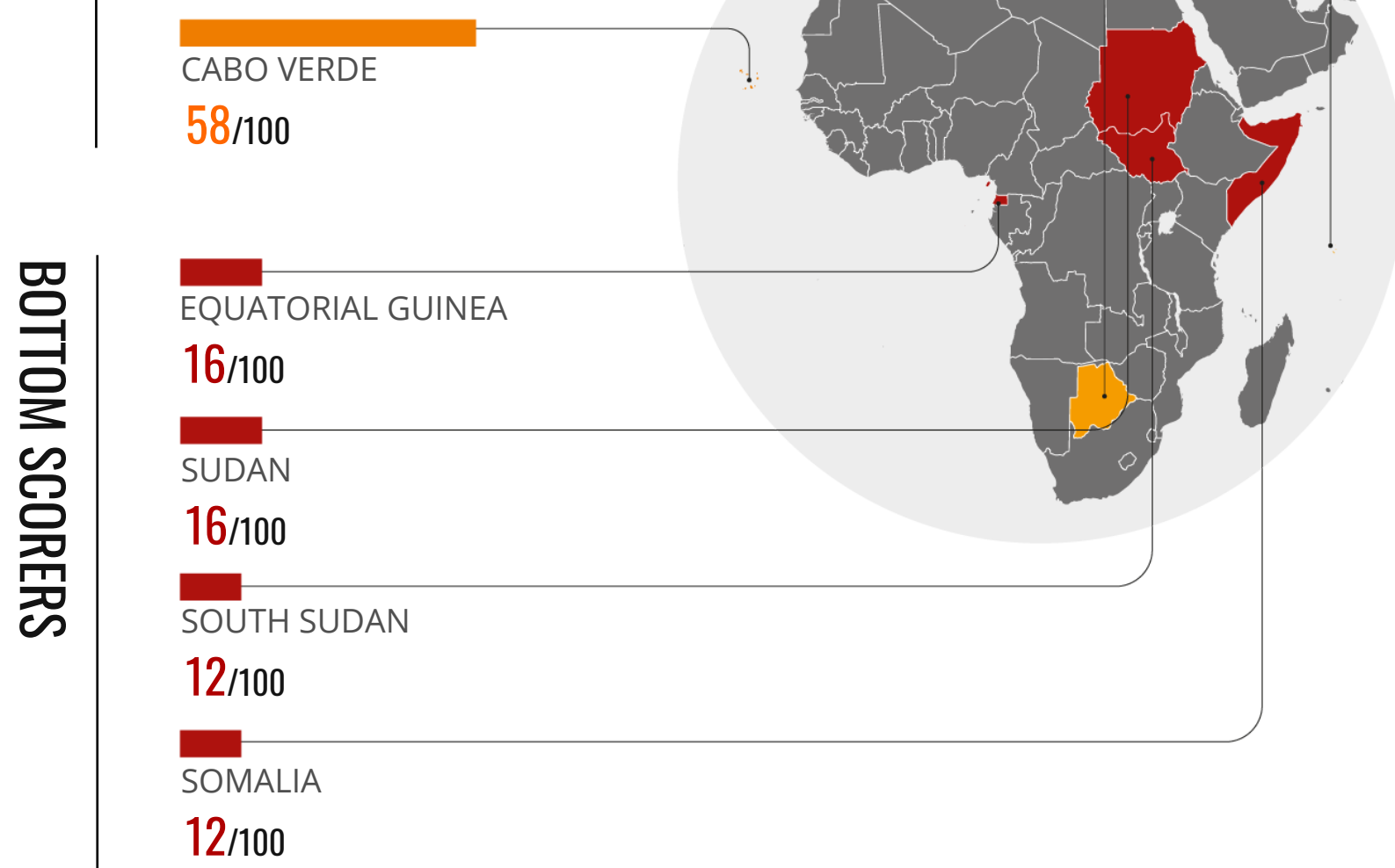


CORRUPTION PERCEPTIONS INDEX 2020

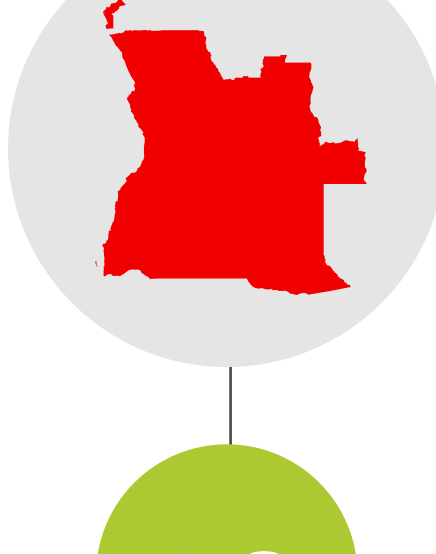
